ORCA: The Man and The Mission Behind it.

In 2012 Mayor Gray spoke at the Annual Reentry Conference sponsored by The Office on Returning Citizen Affairs and he said, "I want all of the residents of the **District of Columbia to** know that they can come back to the district when they are released." Since then, he and Director **Charles Thornton have set** out to ensure that district residents not only return. but have vital resources and support systems in place to enable them to have an opportunity to successfully reintegrate. **Charles Thornton has made** major strides since becoming the Director of the agency in 2011. He orchestrated the largest M.O.U. between federal and municipal agencies to ensure the seamless transition for returning citizens by reducing the duplication of services and simplifying the wide web of district resources. ORCA has opened a newly renovated Reentry **Resource Center complete** with a digital lab, and space for assessments where clients will be able to express their needs and goals. ORCA has a referral process in place where they will connect returning citizens to crucial agencies who are on board to assist returning citizens with the daunting task of reentry. **ORCA** is also spearheading a female reentry initiative. In lieu of the fact that women are the fastest growing group of people who are becoming incarcerated, and over 100,000

children have mothers in

prison ORCA has resigned to developing gender specific programs. In addition to providing employment services to female returning citizens

ORCA has launched The W.I.R.E. (Women Involved in Reentry Efforts). The W.I.R.E. is a group of candid, resilient women who have served time in the criminal justice system and their supporters. The women of the W.I.R.E. have first hand knowledge of how to successfully navigate through the reentry process. Members of the W.I.R.E. will engage in leadership training to become mentors to women returning from incarceration and educate community based organizations on the gender specific issues that

female returning citizens face.

It is strongly believed that reentry should start prior to release and Director Thornton has collaborated with Faith Based Organizations, Government Agencies and Community Based Organizations to visit correctional institutions sponsoring Reentry Resource Fairs. Just this summer the group visited Rivers Correctional Institution, FCI Cumberland and there are plans in place to visit the women at SFF **Hazelton soon. Director** Charles Thornton is on a mission to help reduce recidivism in the District of Columbia and working tirelessly to raise ORCA up as the reintegration model for the country.
